Oxeye daisy may be mistaken as Shasta daisy and is often sold as such in nurseries. The main difference, besides a more robust flower and leaves on Shasta daisy is its presence of a root ball that allows it to stay in ornamentation. Oxeye daisy has a creeping root system that allows it to quickly take over and reduce the foraging capacity of meadows and rangeland.
